What do you feel makes you uniquely qualified to serve in the position for which you seek election?

What do you see as the most important issues facing our profession and how would you respond to these issues as a SEMPA Board member?

SEMPA can meet the needs of the membership by providing this service. We already offer an excellent conference designed for EM PAs but the possibilities are endless. I also see us working with our partner organization, ACEP, in meeting the educational needs of the membership.
